TOTLEY CONTINUES to keep its association with the Lord Mayor during 1983/84.

Sheffield's new Mayor will be Dr. Peter Jones of Grove Road, Totley.

to Frecheville.

Dr. Jones has been a Councillor for twenty years representing the Horfolk Park area and has held posts in Housing and Personnel Services. His reward now, is that of Lord Mayor. He sees his duties as a 'link man' between the many constituencies of Sheffield, its Council and visitors.

Dr. Jones sees this as a year to remember, especially because of the opportunity to include his wife in many of the duties he will perform.

Dr. Jones' five children have all attended King Learner's School.

TOTLEY RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION REPORT FOR 1982/83 AT THE ANNUAL MEETING - 26th APRIL

Items presented from the above report are as follows:

1. During the year the committee has met 11 times, all of them well attended. The public meeting that took place at the County School on 20th April gave an opportunity to report on the major items that have been receiving attention, and we were glad to see over 70 people present there.
2. War Memorial. Our hopes to see the work completed by November 1982 were dashed. But after long and protracted correspondence, we understand that the work is now in hand to an agreed specification. TRA has offered to pay half the cost, i.e. £282.50. Our original offer of £200 was shown to be insufficient, and we felt it right to make an increased offer - we hope that local residents may wish to be associated with our gesture and help us with donations. (These have now started to come in and the suggestion of collecting boxes in local shops is to be looked into).
3. Environment. (a) TADFS were congratulated for the work now completed on the Pinfold. (b) Blacka Moor. Our Assn. made representations regarding the proposed use of Blacka

Moor and consequent enclosure, in general support of the CPRE and other concerned bodies. We understand that the situation is to be reviewed following independent expert advice (yet to be obtained). The Council seem to have been surprised at the strength of opinion generated over their proposals and decisions previously announced.

(The Independent continues to receive letters on this subject and the writers are thanked).

3. TRA has joined the Sheffield Federation of Tenants and Residents Associations. This body is recognised by the Council as a means of communication with its housing tenants and we were particularly concerned to be in on the discussion of "Area Management" which we understand to mean that Totley council housing will be administered from Meadowhead. This seems to us to be of doubtful value, and no improvement.

4. Community Centre. Our submission to the Council is still with them. It is being considered by several different committees within the council, and as yet we have no further information. However, we were informed at the public meeting that the Housing Committee accepts the need for some kind of community facility for those who live on a number of the smaller council estates - and this includes Totley. This information led to a strong assertion on the part of those present that such a provision, if made only for council Tenants, would divide our community in a way that is fundamentally opposed to the ideals of the TRA and of many local residents.

It is our stated aim to build up a single community, and to overcome barriers between one area and another in TADFS district. Any facilities provided should move towards that ideal - and not in opposition to it.

5. Road Safety. As we said last year, we have not been surprised that the Totley Rise improvements have been only partially successful. The Council did not see fit to accept our recommendations - and most of the remaining difficulty is a direct consequence of that failure on their part. But we continue to press for action. We have

had some limited success elsewhere, and some further points concerning road safety and surfacing were brought up at the public meeting.

6. The Totley Independent continues to flourish - though circulation has dropped slightly. The quality of this monthly magazine has continued to draw appreciative comment, and it is widely admired.

7. The Totley Older Peoples Society (TOPS) has continued to meet regularly; Mr. Carter Wigg has recently retired from its leadership and Br. Heyland is his successor. This group is one of the bodies we have helped to initiate and support, and we thank Mr. Wigg for his sterling work in helping to get it firmly established.

8. The Sports Night in the Park; the Christmas Party for Senior Citizens (held this year at Highfield Hall in the Polytechnic); and the last Dinner Dance were all most enjoyable and successful events. Our thanks to all who made them possible.

9. For some time we have been concerned about our somewhat haphazard methods of securing membership of the Association. From this Annual Meeting we hope to bring in a new system, which we hope will be simple to operate and encourage fuller participation.

10. The retiring Committee offers its thanks to all who have supported its efforts over the last year, and in submitting this report together with the audited Financial Statement renders this account of its stewardship over the last year.

The following Committee was elected to serve for the next twelve months:
Alan Jockel, John Perkinson, Margaret Caldwell, Ken Caldwell, Les Firth, Betty Higgins, Ian Ibbotson, Christine Lomas, Margaret Sedons, Harry Wooffinden, John Turner, Dr. Bob Burns, Edwin Paddock. Ethel Beeton was re-invited to serve as minutes secretary. Representatives from TOPS, the Independent, the Road Safety Committee and Badminton section will be chosen by their respective groups. A slight alteration was made to the constitution, to allow an increase in the number of committee members.

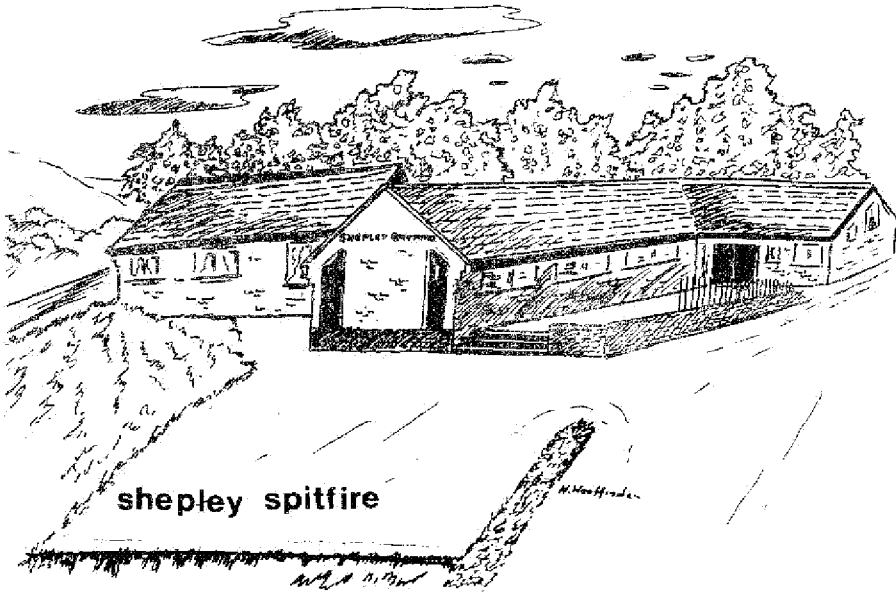

The strongest reaction of the evening came when it was learned that general acceptance had been recognised from the Councils Housing Committee of the need for a Community Facility for council tenants, at least. The audience, representing a good cross section of Totley folk, were up in arms and unanimous including the council tenants present, that any proposal, as such, for only one section of locals, was undesirable, to say the least.

The Totley community is united and single minded on this issue and irrespective of any outside influence will remain so.

Councillor Jack Thompson, who attended the meeting, stated that he was both surprised and pleased to hear this response. From the tone of the A.C.M., held the following week at the Cross Scythes, it would appear that the new L.R.A. Committee will urge and do all possible to bring this long-standing need to a successful conclusion.

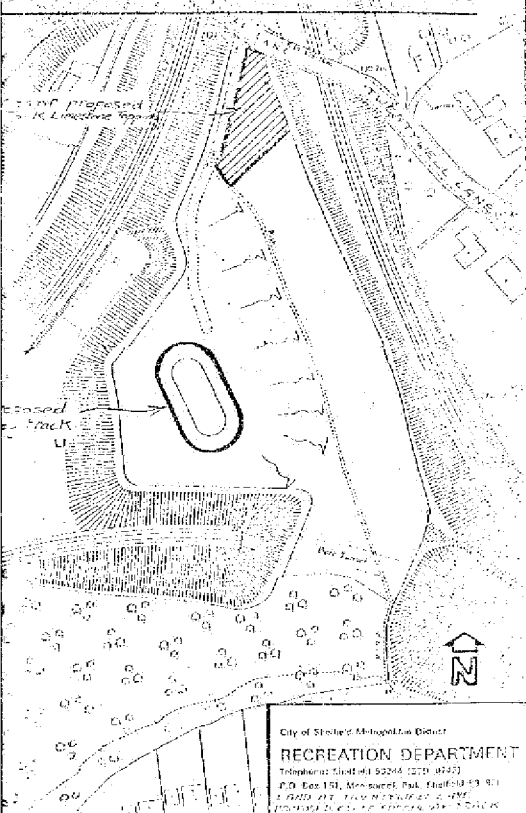
GOODBYE & HELLO

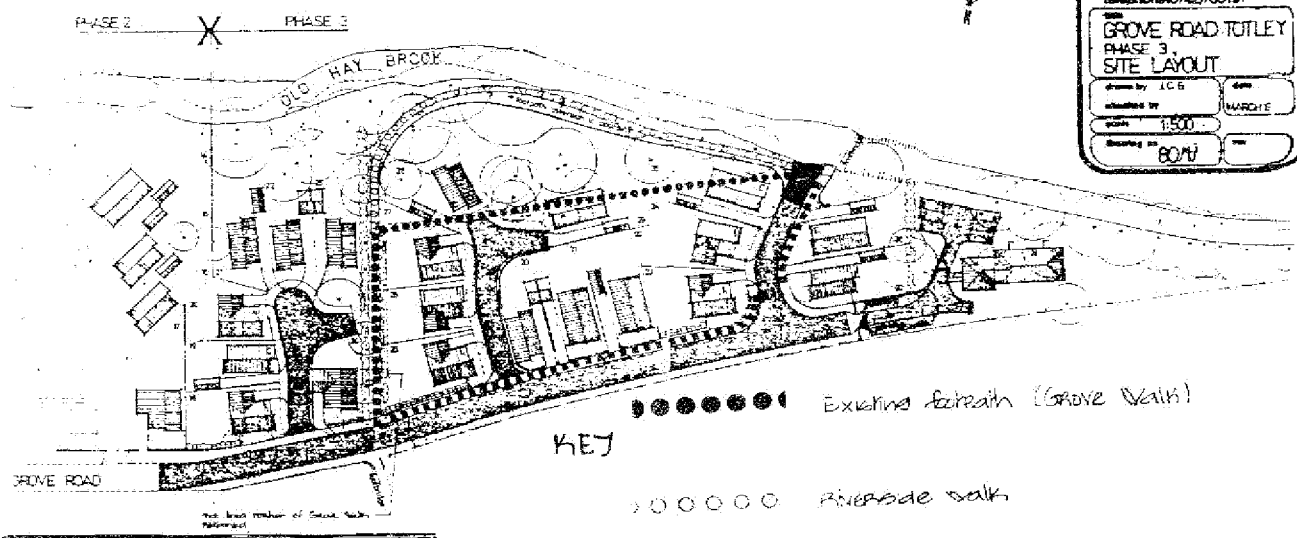

LIBRARY

RILLING THROUGH my desk the other day I turned up a copy of the leaflet which was published when Trolley Branch Library was opened in 1974. Besides information about dimensions, fittings and such, it told me that "The Adult library has shelving for 8,300 books and the Children's library holds 4,000", which means that there was shelf space for a grand total of a little over 12,000 books. These days things have altered a little. At the last count we had a stock of 21,000 books in adult and 9,000 in junior. If you assume that roughly a third of them are out on loan at any one time, then we have a collection of roughly 20,000 books on display in a library which was originally designed to hold 12,000. Talk about trying to get a quart into a pint pot - This of course explains why we now have to use every available inch of space, including those shelves 'way down near the floor. I very so often I'll hear one borrower say to another, "I've read every book in this library", or, "I can never find anything I haven't read", which might not be strictly true, but I know what they mean: even with 20,000 books in front of you

(and 3,000 brand-new books each year) it's sometimes difficult to find what you want.

For one thing we can't hope to buy everything that's published, and so inevitably people will want to read books that we haven't got. In such cases we'll be delighted to get them for you for a small reservation fee of 20p. (which isn't bad when you consider that even an average novel costs around 89 these days).

In other cases, we've got the stock but it's already out on loan. Some books are so popular that when they're returned they only get to sit on the shelves for a couple of minutes before someone else takes them out again. These books can also be reserved for you, for the same price of 20p.

Catherine Cookson is our most popular author bar none for instance, but you wouldn't think we had many of her books at all if you were to look at the shelves. It's very unusual for there to be more than a couple of her books in, but can you guess how many we actually have? Think about 10, then look at the end of this article to see if you're right. Books on Computing are getting to be nearly as popular; you can never find any in, but we've got over 30 in stock. Here are just a few:
