

# GARDENING TIPS

What a pleasant winter up to now. The spring garden will be early this year unless old Jack Frost does his work.

My garden is showing lots of signs of spring, I have blossom on the Primus Nigra and primula and pansies well on their way, the daffodils are nearly in flower and tulips are well on their way bearing in mind it is only mid Feb when I am writing. One of the drawbacks of a mild winter is that the bug community has not been cut back by a hard frost and therefore extra vigilance will be needed to protect those delicate plants and seedlings from the ravages of slugs, aphids, woodlice etc.

#### Things to do in March

- \* Sow hardy annuals as soon as ground is crumbly enough to work. Self sown or over wintered annuals can be transplanted to more suitable spots now.
- \* Cut back herbacious perennials left over from the autumn. Tender plants such as penstemons shouldbe left until the end of March.
- \* Plant autumn sown sweet pea seedlings and sow more for cutting later in the season.
- \* Lift and divide any perennials you missed in autumn. Divide into small portions and plant in groups for a natural look.
- \* Watch out for slugs feeding on young shoots, especially delphiniums.
- \* Plant gladioli putting them in at least 4" deep.
- \* Take cuttings of dahlias and root them in a propogator or on a warm window-sill.
- \* Check labels on deciduous trees & shrubs. It's much easier when the leaves are off.
- \* Check your tree ties. Remove them from trees which are established, check the ones that are to stay.
- \* If you pruned your shrub roses during the winter or after flowering check them for frost-damaged wood below the cuts and prune back to healthy wood.
- \* Remove old flowering heads of hydrangeas and cut down to next pair of strong buds.

- \* Prune Buddleia davidii varieties really hard as far into the old wood as you like. Look out for seedlings. Pull them up and burn them they will not be any good.
- \* Apply a dressing of general fertiliser to top fruit early in the month if not already done. Fork it in lightly.
- \* Clear strawberry bed of weeds before they start to grow again. Also remove dead strawberry leaves from the plants.
- \* Cut down cames of autumn fruity raspberries, make sure other cames are well supported to prevent wind damage.
- \* Prepare areas for sowing grass seed next month.
- \* Straighten lawn edges if they were not done duringthe winter.
- \* Give lawns their first cut setting the blades higher than normal.
- \* Increase the ventilation and watering in the greenhouse as the weather dictates. Be careful not to
  wet the leaves as the cold nights
  and damp conditions encourage grey
  mould.
- \* Shade seedlings and fresh cuttings from bright sunlight.

  If a frost is expected at night cover with newspaper.
- \* Feed plants which are due to flower soon once a fortnight with a weak solution of Phostrogen.
- \* Sow seeds of half hardy annuals which are for bedding outdoors and pot culture in the greenhouse.
- \* Sow indoors in heat tender vegetables such as aubergines, tomatoes and peppers; also celeriac because it needs as long a growing season as possible.
- \* Start planting early potatoes but listen for frost warnings which may catch young shoots and cover with newspaper at night.
- \* Direct outdoor sowings can be made of broad beans and peas. Peas fare better if they are pregerminated indoors.
- \* Treat paths and drives to keep them clear of weeds.
- \* Order summer flowering bulbs
- \* Start a new compost heap.

Lots to do this month so get cracking.

The very moist summer last year ensured that potato crops grew rapidly with most plants producing bigger than normal tubers and a high overall yield. Two problems have arisen from this;

- there is a glut of the larger sized ware (or eating) potatoes with prices on the floor.
- 2. there is a dearth of the smaller sized seed potatoes, with prices of some varieties rising rapidly. As a consequence of this many growers are ceasing production.

All you housewives will know that there are several varieties of potatoes i.c. Bostons, Pembrokes, Bakers, reds, whites amd cara. Unfortunately only the last one is a variety, the first two refer to the place the potatoes are grown, whilst reds or whites only reflects the skin colour of over 30 varieties, all of which have different good or bad points in respect of their production and cooking qualities. 'Record' for instance, although a poor yielder, is excellent for crisp production and is only grown on contract to crisp manufacturers. Listed below is a selection of varieties with a 1-10 assessment of their growing/cooking qualities. See how many you recognise or have seen in the shops. Edwin Pocock


In search of Houndkirk Delights. Distance  $7\frac{1}{2}m$ . Allow about 4 hrs. Hiking Boots desirable for several wet patches across Houndkirk Moor.

Proceed down Hillfoot Rd to Chapel
Lane, cobbled causeway to Penny Lane
and the Popular Cricket Inn, 100yds
above the pub and opposite the Sports
Field we enter Bents Farm, where to
the right of the farmyard we climb
over a stile. (Note the adjacent
home-stead which was once the site
of the Grouse Inn a popular hostelry
with local farmers over 30 years ago).

The path swings across left over the fields and we head for the fashionable Hamlet of Old Hay. Cross a quaint bridge that spans the infant Old Hay Brook. Enter a drive to our left as we fringe Hillfoot Rd. 50 yds along the lame we pass the imposing Avenue Farm. An attractive weir catches our eye across the field. Follow the yellow markers to the head of the drive. A field area takes us forward across a gentle slope to Shorts Lane (Home of the popular Dore Riding Stables). Enter a bridle way to our left and before us lies the charm of Blacka Moor. Pass the Blacka Dyke on our left and beyond the Ford to the

main"Piper House Gate" route where 50yds along we cross a tiny foot-bridge and head right for Devils Elbow Gate. (There is a sign post -but recently damaged and lying in the stream bed). The path climbs fairly steeply for ½ mile. A gritstone causeway threads its route through Bilberry patches as we head for the Fox House Road. Cross the busy main road with caution and walk 200 yds back towards Whirlow and just beyond the old site of the Devils Elbow Rd. (Now a corporation storage and tip site).

We now enter Houndkirk Moor via a kissing gate directly opposite the top of Whitelow Lane. Glorious Heather moors to tread. Locate a concrete post on the rising slope under Houndkirk Hill and around us a breathtaking scene of glorious landscape. Make a slight detour from the post to scale the fine gritstone escarpement of Houndkirk Hill, at nearly 1400 ft the highest point of the walk. Maybe the ideal spot to take a refreshment break. Head back to the concrete pillar and cross the Red Car Brook 100yds below. Be bold crossing Houndkirk Moor. 10 minutes later we strike the popular highway and ancient track known as the Houndkirk road. Walk towards Fox House and The parsons House. As we leave the last gate swing over to the left towards Stoney Ridge, where near by the ruined farmstead stands



an old ToIl Bar boundary stone, site of a coaching road.

Cross the busy road where the new Stoney Ridge and Fox House highway junction meets with care and enter the peaceful sanctuary again of Blacka Moor. A main track fringes a lovely line of Rhododendron bushes towards our own Totley Moor.

Passing the site of lonely Strawberry Lee Farm must conjure thoughts of a noble dignity in its lofty position. All that remains at this spot from its by-gone age are piles of stones.

The track descends under Blacka Hill, well defined and superb views of the city unfold before us like a map. This is bilberry picking country. In the height of the summer these lovely luscious little fruits are a treat to all willing to suffer a touch of backache.

The track broadens through a fine avenue of Beech trees and soon we rejoin a surfaced road at the head of Strawberry Lee Lane. A short stroll and we are back to the sports field and the Cricket Inn and home, sooner or later:

#### Coffee mornings


March is Library Promotion month. when there will be a nationwide campaign to promote the use of libraries and to enlist support for library services.


